## **GROUP LEADERS REPORT 2010**

2010 has been another busy year for the group with all sections delivering an exciting range of fun activities and events for our youth members.

At the start of the year the group was awarded the Mayoral award for good scouting. This is an annual trophy presented to groups who have a high level of youth retention, clean and presentable halls and offer a well rounded scouting program. The group is also the 5<sup>th</sup> largest group in the state a fact that was recognised in a recent publication of the scouting magazine.

The sections have had a busy year either attending or preparing for major events. The scouts attended the 22<sup>nd</sup> Australian Jamboree in January at Cataract Park in Sydney. The Joeys attended Kangaree in April 2010 at Gilwell Park and the Cubs are preparing for Cuboree in September.

The sections have again been very active in their individual programs attending and running such events as zoo days, visits to the Scout air wing, stradbroke cup, scout hike, rowallan camp, skiing at Baw Baw, hiking at Wilsons prom, sleep overs, fantastic race just to name a few.

At a committee level the group has made some major equipment acquisitions this year spending approximately \$14,000 on new equipment including mess tents, sleeping tents and new chairs for the scout hall. We have also spent approximately \$1,500 on repairs and maintenance at the scout halls. We have been successful in obtaining a grant for the construction of a disabled ramp at the King George hall which is awaiting the issuing of a building permit. These are the benefits of running a group that is in a strong financial position and has continued astute financial management.

The financial position has been assisted by the group participating in the Scout Raffle this year which we have found worthwhile and our successful fundraising activities which have been tremendously supported by local business donating products for raffles and auction items. We also generate significant revenue from our two halls although hall hire revenue has dropped off in recent years.

On a disappointing note at the 2010 census the group recorded its first reduction in youth numbers in 5 years. Although the situation was somewhat restored following census with some new members. It should be remembered that our group is the combination of two groups being 5<sup>th</sup> Central and 6<sup>th</sup> Central Moorabbin and as such we should always strive to have high numbers in each of our sections.

We have been successful in recruiting Andrew and Carol as new cub leaders during the year. We are still striving to find some Venturer leaders so that we can again start our own Venturer unit and we could also do with some more committee members.

I would like to take this opportunity to make special mention of Dale McNabb who is my assistant group leader and extend a big thankyou to him for all the work he has done at the group and in supporting me over the last 12 to18 months while I have had less time for scouts due to home renovations, the arrival of a new baby and business commitments. Dale has also been instrumental in creating our new website that is becoming the hub of all communication.

I would like to end by thanking all the section leaders, our president Alan Green and all the committee members for all their hard work and the fantastic job they do in running the group.

# Treasurer's Report - 2009/2010

Our bank and investment accounts are showing a healthy combined balance of \$51,866.49 which allows us to continue to fund the group's activities.

The Net Surplus (Profit) for the year was \$1,838.48 which is a great result given that we have purchased over \$10,000 worth of new tents for the group to use.

Although Hall Hire, which is the major source of income after Subscriptions has decreased, this is mainly due the timing of payments from long term hirers.

Income is only slightly down from last year, as Registration Fees are now included in the Balance Sheet as are Registration Payments, previously under Expenses.

We have spent significantly more on Equipment this year; the tents mentioned in the first point and on 82 new chairs for the Hall. The chairs were funded from the 2009 Volunteer Grant Scheme.

Repairs & Maintenance - 5th Hall is higher this year due to the floors being redone, plumbing bills for blocked toilets & a leaking roof and for shelving materials in the storage room.

Electricity & Water for 6th Hall is higher than it should be as we were overcharged for the last 6 months. This has now been resolved and we have been given a credit.

# 5th/6th Central Moorabbin Scout Troop Annual Section Report July 2009 - June 2010

We currently have 34 registered members in the Scout troop which is an increase in numbers compared to the start of 2010. We gained 11 Scouts from the Cub-Scout section and 2 new members over the last 12 months. We have had a few Scouts leave us as they turned 15 and moved on the Venturers or because of commitments to other activities.

We kicked off with our annual Ski camp in July to Mount Baw Baw, we had a group of 29 staying at the Mount Baw Baw Ski Club. And luckily the weather did the right thing and will had two great days of skiing.

In August we had 12 Scouts participate in the GES Fantastic Race, which took them around the bay. On the Saturday they travelled from Ormond to Frankston on the train and the via mini bus to Sorrento, then Sunday across to Queenscliff on the ferry, steam train to Drysdale and coach back to Ormond stopping to do a number of activities on the way.

In early September our Patrol leaders went on along to a cub camp at Caringal Scout Camp to assist. Our troop was paired with 1st Kooweerup Scout Troop and Phillip Island Scout Troop to form Troop 1003.

Activities at the Jamboree included things like a city tour in Sydney, a day at the Water park, water activities in Sydney Harbour, abseiling, plane flights, giant slide, circus, market day and lots more. We also had nightly entertainment in the main arena with bands, comedians and magicians. It was a full on fortnight.

We kicked off term one with a camp to Mount Baw Baw to relax and recover. In March we had a Jamboree reunion camp then in April this year we had two patrols compete in the

Annual Stradbroke Cup at Bay Park Scout camp in Mount Martha. All 12 Scouts that went along had a really great time, one patrol achieved Bronze and the other Silver.

In May we had a troop camp to Dallas Brooks Scout Camp in Upper Beaconsfield. The camp that a survival theme. Scouts had to build shelters from what they could find in the bush and then sleep in them overnight.
